

Due to their lack of training, pastors in the Hmong Fellowship Church held to a variety of interpretations of God's Word. Congregations and their pastors once fought over which man-made rules were God-pleasing and could earn people passage into heaven. future of their church body, they realize the importance

Other large ongoing expenses will be living and travel costs for the hundreds of rural church leaders who will rotate through the training center on an annual basis, and the travel expenses incurred when the five top HFC leaders conduct regional seminars in the nine districts
