
WELS Home Missions plants new churches and assists mission-minded congregations in the United States, Canada, and English-speaking West Indies. Home Missions currently supports 144 congregations with financial subsidy or district mission board/mission counselor assistance, with 28 of those being cross-cultural mission congregations. Home Missions also provides more than 35 campus ministries with financial support, while assisting hundreds of other congregations that serve college students around the United States and Canada.

Faces of Faith - Sonny and Lucy

I met Sonny and Lucy at the funeral of their daughter. They were obviously devastated. I asked them if I could come for a visit, and we started on a year-long study of the Bible while they tried to teach me Mandarin. Lucy grew up in the Christian church in Indonesia, but at age 12 she moved back to China and never went back to church. Her husband Sonny was a stubborn atheist, a professor of philosophy, and member of the communist party in China. But the death of their daughter had shaken them. After eight months of study, Sonny said to me one day with tears in his eyes, "Pastor, before I met you I never thought about God. Now all I do is think about God." I baptized Sonny not long after that in his home, and two months later the Lord took Sonny home to heaven. Lucy joined Living Hope, but later moved to New Jersey to live with her son. Before she



100 MISSIONS IN 10 YEARS

WELS Home Missions approved 15 new home mission starts and enhancements in March 2023. These are the first missions approved toward our synod's goal of starting 100 missions and enhancing 75 ministries in the next ten years.

Cincinnati is starting a second site in the Oakley and Hyde Park neighborhoods, just northeast of downtown. This new location would put Beautiful Savior closer to three colleges in the area, opening opportunities for Campus Ministry growth.

(1) Idaho Falls, Idaho: The Mormon church has a strong historical presence in this growing area. The 11-person core group has been working with Truth in Love Ministries to understand how to best reach out to this demographic.




Calispell, Mont.: Kalispell is considered the fastest growing micropolitan city (10,000-50,000 popula-

tion) in the United States and is 100 miles away from the nearest WELS church. The dedicated core group has been gathering for worship on a regular basis for years.



Kronenwetter, Wis.: Five WELS churches in the greater Wausau, Wis., area are supporting a new mission in Kronenwetter. This growing community south of Wausau is home to Northland Lutheran High School, which will house this new church and provide mission-minded staff and students to support the outreach effort.

Marquette, Mich.: Marquette serves as the hub in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan, and 52 percent of the people in and around Marquette do not have a home church or attend a church. It is also home to 7,000 students at Northern Michigan University, a ripe opportunity for a Campus Ministry program.

Panama City Beach, Fla.: Amazing Grace in Panama City is looking to expand west and start a second site in the greater Panama City Beach area.




ENHANCEMENTS

Enhancements at existing congregations could include calling an additional pastor or staff minister, starting a cross-cultural ministry, or restarting a church where members have renewed their efforts to go with the gospel into their community. Two of these enhancements are unsubsidized, which means they have access to their district mission board, mission counselor, synodical support staff, and special project funds, but do not receive direct financial support.




Faces of Faith - Dillon

Faces of Faith - Angie

Welcome Weekend at Redeemer in Ann Arbor, Mich., is our annual September outreach event for our Campus Ministry program. That weekend in 2021, I met someone new. Angie was born in China, but her family moved to America when she was young. She earned her bachelor's and master's in piano performance at the prestigious Juilliard School in New York City. Now she's earning a doctorate at the University of Michigan. One of her classmates, Allison, who was in the same program had already been attending Redeemer. After church, Angie decided to stay for lunch and then came to Starbucks to help us plan our Campus Ministry activities for the semester. She then started attending our Campus Ministry Bible studies. When she asked about being baptized, we found a spot in central campus, and I listened to Angie share more of her story. That conversation led to starting Bible 101 classes—often meeting on Zoom until 10 p.m.—after she finished classes and I put my kids to bed. In April 2022, Angie was baptized and confirmed, and many other Campus Ministry students shared that special day with us. Now as a member of Redeemer,

Angie shares her talent by playing for

church. We're so thankful to hear her beautiful music in worship, but we're even more thankful for what God has done in her life.





When I first transferred to the University of Wisconsin-Stout, the students at our WELS Campus Ministry took me in and made me feel welcome when I felt lost in a new environment. From then on, I made Campus Ministry my home and got as involved as I could.

Our Campus Ministry has faced obstacles in the time I have been here. We kept the program going through a pastor vacancy, and we're still calling a second

pastor for our large congregation.
We continued our Bible studies and fellowship and were recently blessed to welcome Pastor Kieta to our congregation. I feel incredibly grateful to have been able to watch our Campus Ministry grow.
Through every hardship, we've still had new opportunities arise for our group in the last few years, such as taking part in the Awake and Alive conference and a Mission Journeys short-term

mission trip.

Reflecting on where I was when I began college, my faith has certainly branched out and flourished since then. The experiences I've had through Campus Ministry brought me closer to God and lit a flame in my life that propelled me to take my faith seriously. I will carry this flame wherever the Lord quides me in the future.





WELS Joint Missions supports mission opportunities that are the responsibility of Home Missions, World Missions, and Ministerial Education. Much of this work centers around diaspora (people-group) ministries, where immigrants who have joined our fellowship in the United States and Canada are able to take the gospel back to friends and family in their country of origin. Joint Missions administers the work of the Pastoral Studies Institute (PSI) and assists in other cross-cultural outreach efforts and new programs, like WELS Mission Journeys. The Joint Mission Council has identified people from Bangladesh, Cambodia, China, Colombia, Cuba, India, Korea, Liberia, Mexico, Pakistan, South Sudan, Syria, Ukraine, Vietnam, and other countries who have interest in training to take the gospel to their own people groups here in the United States and in their countries of origin.

Faces of Faith - Salma

"Pastor, there's just one thing holding me up." My stomach dropped. It was Salma's day to be confirmed in worship—was she going to back out?

Salma is an immigrant to Detroit from a country in Latin America. She comes from a family with Islamic roots. She and her sister are the only two converted Christians in their family. So, they began a ministry—first to reach their family with the gospel, then to reach people in their community. Before they had left their country, they'd essentially established churches for women. All sorts of

skeptics interested in the faith to the wives of local governors suffering from the stress of being in such a high position. Since moving to Detroit, she has been reaching out to Spanish-speaking immigrant women with the gospel to teach them about Christ and plug them into the ministry of a local congregation.

And so, the one thing holding her up on that Sunday morning was this: "Pastor, can I work within the scope of the church's mission to reach out to women, teach them about their identity in Christ, and bring them to church?" My emotions flipped from that feeling of rejection to pure joy. "Salma, we can figure that out! So, yes!" May God bless her heart for Christ and those who don't yet know him, and may she bring as many people to church as possible!

It was this choice that would not only set Lah apart from her friends, but also greatly change her faith life. Growing up, Lah's entire family had been Baptist. To this day, Lah is one of only two Lutherans in her

family. Thanks to her time at Christ-St. Peter,
Lah came to have a new perspective on her faith,
and she was both confirmed and baptized in 2016. Now,

Lah is a member at St. Peter, adding to the number of other worshipers in attendance who immigrated from Thailand. She says that she is constantly thankful for her faith because "there's temptation every day," and she would not be where she is without God.

The Pastoral Studies Institute (PSI), a partnership between WELS Joint Missions and Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary, provides pre-seminary and seminary training to North American students from a variety of countries and cultures. PSI also consults with regional World Missions teams and sister churches around the world on their theological education programs and coordinates advance degree programs and visiting instructors upon request.

Faces of Faith -David and Guili

It's an enormous blessing for a congregation to have a PSI student in their midst, but two? Hope in Toronto, Ont., Canada, has been blessed with just that. In February 2021, Dr. David Shang (pictured left) was accepted as a PSI student. He has been advancing quickly through his studies and gaining a large following through his monthly YouTube lectures. He currently has over 3,000 viewers in five countries, which has led to approximately 19 baptisms (with 18 more on the way) in three countries.

In January 2023, Guili and Dujie Chi were received into membership at Hope. Guili (pictured

right) also wants to reach more of his fellow

Chinese with the gospel of Jesus. With some encouragement, Guili became the second PSI student at Hope.

David and Guili's dream is to create a Chinese church within Hope's congregation in Toronto. It's beginning with David's online lectures and carrying over to in-person Bible studies in Guili and Dujie's home every Sunday night where they regularly have 10-15 in attendance. Guili

recently shared, "Many Chinese immigrants come to Canada for a better life or better future for their children. It's a country that God has blessed. People should come to know the true God, to know that only through Christ we can live in peace and preserve the future of our children. Live in his grace, share the gospel, live a godly life, keep the faith, and blessings from generation to generation will come."

- Two Vietnamese men from Boise, Idaho, graduated from PSI in 2023. Additional opportunities for Vietnamese ministries are being explored with these graduates in mind.
- Our Savior in San
 Antonio, Tex., is working with a current PSI student originally from India to share the gospel with other Indians in the San Antonio community.

DID YOU KNOW?

PSI is currently training 25 students from **nine different people groups in 17 locations** throughout North America.

WORLD MISSIONS SUPPORTS MISSION WORK:

- on Native American reservations, where the gospel is being shared on the Apache reservations in Arizona and exploratory mission work is beginning on other reservations throughout North America;
- in Africa, where missionaries are partnering with national church bodies in seven countries and are exploring outreach in at least six more countries throughout the continent;
- in Asia, where 16 missionaries have joined together to equip, encourage, and empower others to bring the good news of Jesus Christ to 1.8 billion unreached souls;

- in Latin America, where hundreds of thousands of people are being reached through Academia Cristo online courses and more than 20 individuals are actively leading a group in worship and study;
- in Europe, where missionaries partner with national churches to train the next generation of church leaders and bring the true gospel to countries without a strong Lutheran presence;
- and through Multi-Language Productions, which has produced materials in more than 56 languages and reaches tens of thousands of Englishspeakers in more than 30 different countries through the TELL online training platform.



EUROPE

The Europe mission team partners to share Christ's grace in Albania, Bulgaria, London and the U.K., Portugal, Russia, and Ukraine while supporting sister church bodies in seven additional European countries. Currently there are three WELS missionaries residing in Europe.

Faces of Faith - Perry

God has taken Perry Wong on an interesting journey to our church in London. Perry was born in Hong Kong. She was not raised Christian, but she attended Christian primary school. It wasn't until she started lecturing at universities in Hong Kong that she realized there was something missing in her life. She insists, "It was

the Holy Spirit's work. I am a very stubborn person." At the encouragement of her brother, Perry got involved with a Christian reformed church. She was later convinced by a friend to study at Asia Lutheran Seminary. There,

Perry learned that "it is not about what we should do for God, but what he has done for us."



In November 2021, Perry moved away from Hong Kong. She needed a break from teaching fashion at the university level. The school board had begun to discourage conversations about cultural and historical topics. She felt she could not do her position justice under the new restrictions, and she worried about how her students might be affected. Perry chose to come to London because it was a familiar place that she knew from her own college education.

Upon her arrival, one of Perry's professors from Asia Lutheran Seminary connected her with the new Lutheran

group meeting in London. The church immediately welcomed Perry like one of the family. Perry is excited to see what work God will do through her and others in London and the U.K.!

FAST FACTS

- In March 2023, representatives from Sweden, Finland, Germany, Albania, and WELS gathered in Dunavtsi, Bulgaria, to dedicate a new church. Pastor Iliyan Itsov serves that congregation and five other preaching stations scattered throughout central Bulgaria.
- In April 2023, WELS' sister church in Germany sent its brass choir to Porto, Portugal, where our sister church welcomed seven youth confirmands from five families into fellowship.
- Over 140,000 people from Hong Kong have moved to the U.K. in the past two years following increased Chinese government activity in Hong Kong, providing many new opportunities for ministry.





ASIA

The Asia One Team comprises 16 missionaries serving 17 different countries throughout Asia. The team, largely based in Thailand and Hong Kong, partners with God's people in Asia to equip, encourage, and empower others to bring the good news of Jesus Christ to 1.8 billion unreached souls throughout Asia. Asia Lutheran Seminary continues to provide theological education across the continent.

Faces of Faith - New Zealand

Over three years ago, Pastor Titus Tse, president of the South Asian Lutheran Evangelical Mission (SALEM) in Hong Kong, began meeting online with some SALEM members who had immigrated to New Zealand. They also happened to be former students of Asia Lutheran Seminary. Over time, the original members invited their friends—some Christian, some non-Christian—to join the group. This group has now decided to start a Cantonese-speaking church in Auckland. They began monthly worship in January 2023 and continue to meet weekly online.

Another mission group started by another SALEM member has sprung up in Queenstown as well. In early 2023, the Auckland group leaders met several local pastors from Hong Kong, Taiwan, and other locations to learn how to reach out and form a legal church in New Zealand. Please pray for this exciting work among our Chinese-speaking brothers and sisters who, like the scattered believers in the early church, are carrying the gospel with them wherever they go!



Faces of Faith - Lucy

I was blessed to spend some time at a safe house in India where severely wounded refugees from war-torn Myanmar came to recover. I noticed six-year-old Lucy hiding in her bunk near her mom. Lucy, her family, and community are Christians. A bomb dropped into her school courtyard as school was letting out. The blast killed three classmates and paralyzed Lucy. My heart broke.

I told Lucy the story of Jesus welcoming the little children. We talked about how much Jesus loves Lucy,

how she's safe in Jesus' arms no



it! That's what I'm talking about.

That's the light we see coming from the Christians here." She was talking about the peace, joy, and hope coming from Lucy. "Now we know this is from Jesus."

This Buddhist woman and her husband then learned of six men from their village who were tortured and killed. "We need to be with the families. We need to help them," said the husband. "And we need to tell them about Jesus; this will really help them," said the wife. They were now on a mission to bring the light of Jesus to their people – two lights brightened by the light of Christ shining through a paralyzed six-year-old named Lucy.

Faces of Faith - Kanon

Kanon Haga is a currently a college student and the son of Pastor Haga in Mito, Japan. For the past year, Kanon has been designing and running his own children's events and Vacation Bible School programs for Megumi ("Grace") Lutheran Church, WELS' sister church. While on break from school, he wondered what he could do to serve the Lord. Around that time, a childhood friend reached out to him to ask if he could come to church. Though his friend didn't identify as a Christian, he mentioned that when he was little, church was always very welcoming and warm for him. That same feeling is what inspired Kanon to start creating children's

programs. "I wanted to recreate

that same feeling for the kids, so they see church as a fun and welcoming place." After these events, parents often tell Kanon that while they previously felt nervous or scared of church, these events led them to trust Christians and churches.

And at these children's events,

they get to hear the word of God. Kanon's work shows love to the community and gives a positive image of Christianity to the city, while also sharing the message of the Savior with young hearts.

FAST FACTS

- A group of 22 men and women from Pakistan gathered in Dubai in early 2023 for a Bible Institute Seminar led by WELS missionaries and the South Asian ministry coordinator. It was the first time WELS representatives were able to meet these brothers and sisters in Pakistan in person for close to 10 years.
- Gereja Lutheran Indonesia (GLI), WELS' sister church, has 1,650 members in 29 congregations served by 30 pastors and 5 vicars. Their seminary program currently teaches 27 students.
- The first seminary class of eight men graduated in Nepal in February 2023. The next group of 12 men have already started their seminary studies.

NATIVE AMERICAN MISSION

The Native American mission serves eight churches, one preaching station, and two Lutheran elementary schools on the Fort Apache Reservation and the San Carlos Apache Reservation in Arizona. The mission is currently served by four missionaries, two national pastors, and one national evangelist.

Faces of Faith - Sally

"We're sending her to a Christian school. That's how we're raising her, and that's what we want for her life." It was a big moment in life for Sally. Despite attending elementary school at Peridot-Our Savior's Lutheran School, some family members wanted Sally to participate in a traditional Apache religious ceremony. Her father was standing firm in opposition to it. He wanted her to be about the Lord and his Word and walk a Christian path throughout life.



These words stuck with Sally, even through the spiritual detours of life. They stayed with her when she moved to the big city and away from God. They supported her when addiction took her husband out of her life. **"Seek the Lord"** was the constant advice given to her during tough times, and had she not been in the Word, she's convinced she would not have made it through the especially difficult time when she lost her oldest son.

Today, Sally is still on the Christian path to heaven. She walks with more experience, more scars, and more thankfulness. She's thankful to walk with Malcolm, a Christian husband who encourages her to grow in her relationship with Jesus. She's thankful for a deeper understanding and empathy for the obstacles that people face all around her and thankful for opportunities to serve the Lord. Her eyes are truly open to see people around her, to pray for those who have gone through what she has, and to pray for everyone to know Jesus and walk the path to heaven.

- Growing schools on the Apache Reservations of Arizona give more than 250 children the chance to learn about Jesus each year.
- Four men from the Apache
 Christian Training School
 (ACTS) are reading sermons in local Apache congregations.
- Up to 98 percent of all Native Americans in the United States do not identify as Christians.
- Outreach efforts to the other 572 reservation areas in the United States has begun with a Native Christians counselor position added to reach the four tribes in the Four Corners region of the U.S.



Rev. John Holtz was installed as a Native Christians counselor in October 2022.

LATIN AMERICA

The Latin America mission team uses *Academia Cristo*, an online outreach and training tool, to share God's grace with as many people as possible as well as identify and train potential leaders who can plant churches.

FAST FACTS

- Over 1.8 million people follow

 Academia Cristo on social media.
- Over 900,000 people have downloaded the Academia Cristo mobile app, where they have access to four self-guided courses that present the truths of God's Word.
- Over 630 people have taken at least one live course with Academia Cristo instructors.
- Over 20 groups planted by Academia Cristo students have completed a course on sin, grace, faith, and works. These groups continue to meet regularly for worship and study. They are called Grupos Sembrador.
- In February 2023, the first Grupo Sembrador became an official congregation of Iglesia Cristo WELS Internacional, WELS' sister church body in Latin America, after completing a twoyear church planting program.

Faces of Faith - Sandra

Several years ago, Sandra Luz was searching for a way to study the Word of God. Her husband took it upon himself to help her find a great program. He stumbled upon *Academia Cristo*

online, dug into their resources, and said to his wife, "This one; this is it." Sandra quickly began working her way through the self-study lessons on *Academia Cristo's* mobile app. She was then welcomed into live classes via Zoom led by WELS missionaries. She completed 13 live Zoom courses and officially became a Confessional Lutheran. When asked if she desired to share the gospel message in her community, Sandra responded with,

"How can I not?! People must know."

Now Sandra informally gathers a group of five in her home every Saturday, including the children of these adult students. Guided by a WELS missionary advisor and by her continued courses in *Academia Cristo*, Sandra is currently leading her group through Bible Information Class. Her husband has been regularly attending her gatherings and is now also showing interest in the Confessional Lutheran faith. She prays for a Lutheran church to develop in her border town of Mexico, where there currently is none. She still rejoices in the growth of the members of her group and in those who may soon join her in the Lutheran faith and be able to lead. "Luz" means light, and Sandra Luz certainly is a gospel light in her family and in her community.

MULTI-LANGUAGE PRODUCTIONS

Multi-Language Productions (MLP) has created more than 2.9 million video, audio, print, and online training resources in 56 languages to date. They have also introduced a new online Bible-based training platform called TELL (Think, Evaluate, Learn, Lead), to bring the gospel to English-speakers around the world. With the Lord's blessing, the TELL network will allow for the creation of new TELL platforms in additional languages in the future.

Faces of Faith - Clarise

I'm from Bamenda, Cameroon. It was hard not to feel abandoned when my mother passed away when I was very young. I not only lost my mother, but soon found myself caring for my siblings as well. Not only has my family experienced tremendous loss, but now many families in

Cameroon are suffering due to the unrest. Yet, I



trust that God is working in the background and that I have not been abandoned. The following has kept me going and growing since I was a child: "Every disappointment is a blessing in disguise. . . it might not look like a blessing right away, until the Lord's work is done and you realize how blessed you were to have been through all those moments you thought he had

abandoned you."

I work for Qatar Airways and on a recent flight from Chicago to Doha, I was reminded of that same truth. During that flight, I met several WELS representatives who were traveling to Zambia for meetings. At 30,000 feet, I was introduced to the TELL program. I read my Bible but don't always understand what it is saying. Since downloading the TELL app, it's crazy how I have learned so much in just the first course. I have been using TELL since the day I landed back in Doha. It has really helped in my relationship with God, helped organize my Bible studies, and has changed my life a lot. I see so many things differently now. TELL is amazing. I can't wait for the virtual classes!

- There are more than 200 active TELL students studying God's Word to become group leaders and church planters.
- TELL Network has launched new online training programs in Mandarin and Tagalog.



WELS Multi-Language Productions

(MLP) helped provide Hmong hymnals for members of the Hmong Fellowship Church in Vietnam.



AFRICA

The WELS One Africa Team currently works with established church bodies in Cameroon, Ethiopia, Kenya, Malawi, Nigeria, Uganda, and Zambia, partnering in outreach and assisting with theological education programs. The team is also working with groups or exploring outreach in six additional African countries and following up on contacts identified through Multi-Language Production's TELL program. Currently, seven missionaries serve on the One Africa Team and an additional Multi-Language Productions missionary oversees the TELL Africa program from his home base in Zambia.

FAST FACTS

- · In 2022, three of WELS' sister church bodies in Cameroon and Nigeria graduated a combined 25 men after five years of seminary studies.
- WELS is declaring fellowship with Obadiah Lutheran Synod in Uganda at the 2023 Synod Convention.
- The One Africa Team is in doctrinal discussions with the Africa Mission Evangelism Church, a group of almost 100 Lutheran congregations in northern Tanzania, to see if our church bodies share the same Scriptural beliefs and practices.
- The Confessional Lutheran Institute (CLI) provides sister churches in Africa with formal continuing education and professional development opportunities for African pastors and consultation on seminary programs.



The Lutheran Church of Cameroon has a great tradition of bringing students' wives onto campus to be with their husbands and study Scripture together, as well as develop relationships with other Lutheran pastors' wives.



Faces of Faith - Maksimu

Pastor Maksimu Musa (Moses) is the leader of the Obadiah Lutheran Synod in Uganda. God has blessed him with the opportunity to bring together and grow congregations around the eastern and northern parts of the country. The church had very humble beginnings—three men meeting in one of their homes in 2008. After 15 years, they had worked with very limited resources to gather and shepherd 21 congregations with a total of more than 4,000 souls! Of course, only by God's blessing. Some of that blessing comes in the form of Pastor Musa, a humble leader who has a strong passion for the truth of Scripture and for sharing that truth with

> more people. He also recognizes the importance of sharing the work with others and training new leaders within the

church. With God's continued blessing, Pastor Musa's leadership will continue to benefit the Obadiah Lutheran Synod for years to come and will bring many more to learn the truth about their Savior.

CENTRAL AFRICA MEDICAL MISSION

The Central Africa Medical Mission (CAMM) oversees the Lutheran Mission Rural Health Centre, a permanent clinic in Zambia, and the Lutheran Mobile Clinic in Malawi, where staff travels to five designated villages for a day of clinical work and care. Both clinics focus on providing Christian counseling and education, HIV testing and treatment, malaria treatment, wellness checks and immunizations for children, and treatment of other minor injuries or illnesses. CAMM partners with the Lutheran Church of Central Africa and WELS missionaries to help the spiritual and physical needs of people in Zambia and Malawi.

Born in Lilongwe, Malawi, his faith grew through encouragement from his Christian mother and WELS missionaries. He was confirmed as an adult at Chikhulupiriro Lutheran Church in Mwalaulomwe. Recently, his strong faith and the work of the Holy Spirit brought his father to faith as well. Wilfred loves

the Lord's Prayer because, "I feel like it has got the whole procedure of a Christian life."

Through prayer and a WELS missionary's encouragement, he started his own construction business. He trusted God who rewarded him with a successful business. Now he lets his faith shine through construction work. Having built the new CAMM Msambo clinic and renovated the clinic buildings at Suzi, Thunga, and Mwalaulomwe, he has become the

go-to guy for repairs or construction work at the nurse's house. Wilfred was amazed by the work of the Lutheran Mobile Clinic, which is "just simply out there to help people, not to make money or treat only those that can afford clinical care." He also valued the cooperation and relationship between the church and the clinic.

We rejoice for his spiritual faith and his construction talents, which helped renovate multiple clinic buildings. We look forward to seeing his faith and business grow in the years ahead!

- Together, the clinics in Zambia and Malawi serve close to 80,000 patients a year.
- The cost per patient is about \$3.90, which includes staff salaries and benefits, fuel, maintenance, insurance, utilities, and medications.
