



Missionary Dan Kroll serves on the One Africa Team outreach team, currently working with groups in Cameroon, Liberia, Nigeria, and Uganda. Kroll and his wife Karen live in Lilongwe, Malawi, as empty nesters.

Kroll graduated from Martin Luther College in 1983 and spent three years working on an evangelism program for WELS and Reformation in San Diego, Calif., before starting at Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary. In 1992, Kroll was assigned to Zambia. He served in congregational oversight and general church development through teaching small groups. The Kroll family moved to Lake City, Minn., in 2009 where he served at St. John's Lutheran Church. In 2014, Kroll received a call to re-start the seminary program in Kumba, Cameroon, after it had been inactive for 15 years. Africa mission work was reorganized as the One Africa Team in 2016, while Missionary Kroll continued to focus on the maturing church body in Cameroon and supporting some well-established programs in Nigeria. They moved from Cameroon to Malawi in 2018 when a civil war broke out.

He and his wife, Karen, were married in 1991. They have five adult children: Ezekiel, Josiah, Elijah, Jonah, and Gideon.
